



IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING YOUR MOBILITY



TRANSPORT TO KOSZALIN

Nearest Polish International airports are placed in Gdansk and Szczecin. Good connections are from Berlin as well. In Poland most comfortable and fastest travel is by small buses operating directly from the airports. Optional transport is by train if you landed at the time out of their time-table.

Connection from Szczecin-Goleniów Airport

Early booking is recommended because of limited seats in small, fast bus.

Train

Train terminal Port Lotniczy Szczecin Goleniów is placed in close neighbourhood.

There is no direct connection to Koszalin although you can go to Szczecin or Kołobrzeg station then change to Koszalin.

Connection from Gdańsk Airport

When you get off the plane (GDAŃSK PORT LOTNICZY) use fast city train (PKM) to the main railways stations (PKP).

Airport to Gdańsk Wrzeszcz - every 30 minutes or Gdańsk Główny - choose one of this and please check it before your trip.

Fast City train should have ticket machine outside and inside train. You can use your credit card, but I think that necessary will be conversion of money for PLN. Maybe revolut will be helpful.

You can choose a train from GDAŃSK GŁÓWNY or GDAŃSK WRZESZCZ to KOSZALIN

If you prefer BUS there you have a link. Bus is cheaper, but maybe comfortable will be TRAIN.

Connection from Berlin Airport

There are a lot of communication routes from the airport to the city and regional stations with possibility to change to Poland and Koszalin. It can be confusing so find the simplest options below:

Train

From the airport to Ostbahnhof train station use fast city train (S-Bahn) S3, S5, S7 or S9 line.

Take the connection to Koszalin by regular railways using booking and time-table from the portals:

Transport to Dormitory (Rejtana street)

In order to get to the Dormitory from the train station in Koszalin, it is advisable to take a bus number 14 (bus stop in front of the train station, named: Dworzec PKP 01). Direction: Os. Bukowe. You should get out at the bus stop named: Budowlanka 02. Then walk (about 2 minutes).

You can also go to the bus stop at Zwycięstwa street , opposite Kosmos shopping center

(bus name: Dworzec PKS) and use bus line number 11. Then it looks like this:

Dworzec PKS 2 bus stop (you go past 7 bus stops) Budowlanka 02 get out and go by foot to Rejtana street.

To go from Dormitories to Koszalin University of Technology at Raławicka Street, go by:

Bus number 14, from bus stop named Piłsudskiego 02 (at Traugutta Street), please get out at bus stop named Clausiusa 01 (at Zwycięstwa Street). Then you have to go on foot.

On the bus (MZK) will be ticket machine and you will be able to buy tickets there.

→ EU/EEA CITIZENS

Poland has the health care system based on general health insurance.

Persons covered by the general health insurance are entitled to free health services in the territory of Poland at the health care providers who have concluded contracts with the National Health Fund (NFZ - Narodowy Fundusz Zdrowia.) In case of necessity of providing medical care, a student from a member country staying temporarily in the territory of Poland is entitled to free health care on the

basis of the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or in particular cases on the basis of a special certificate. The student is obliged to present one of these documents (it is advisable to have also a copy) together with an identity document directly to the public health care provider. The student will receive free health services at health care providers who have concluded a relevant contract with NFZ. In case of lack of the European Health Insurance Card or equivalent document, the patient will be obliged to cover costs of treatment by themselves.

– NON-EU/EEA CITIZENS

The students from non-EU/EEA countries should purchase health insurance in their home country, before departure. In case of the ISIC or Euro<26, insurance is included in the card and the student does not need to buy another one unless he/she wants to increase its scope or value. Erasmus students (having so called legitymacja studencka - student card - issued by the host university) are usually allowed to consult doctors at academic medical care centres. Anyway, according to state health regulations foreigners (except the EU/EEA citizens, see above) have to pay for a medical consultation. The cost is then reimbursed by the health insurance company
